Purpose

Provide a framework to maintain the mixed dozen wine-trails to and the itinerary planner to;

To create and maintain a digital online navigation tool and itinerary planner for international wine tourists and domestic wine tourists to see on one platform all the wine, food, tourism experiences available in the Limestone Coast and Western Victoria. The project also interacted with the wine industry providing mentorship, workshops, and guidance on; bookable experiences, ATDW registration, and social media. Research was conducted in collaboration with Uni SA Tourism to characterise visitor and non-visitor personas and demographics.

The Mixed dozen Wine trails project was initially funded by Wine Australia grant PRJ-95 (\$175,000), and PIRSA grant (\$125,000) with \$30,000 from LCGWC and LCLGA (\$5000) SA Touring Route (\$5,000) LCFG (\$1,000). Southern Grampians Shire (\$2500) Mt Gambier Wine growers (\$3,000) Glenelg Shire (\$2500), City of Mt Gambier (\$5000), WRC (\$5,000), Total = \$362,500.00. This project was fully acquitted in March 2021.

The ongoing purpose is to maintain the platform as Wine Tourism is a strategic focus in the five-year strategic plan.
